# **KEEPING OUR CITIZENS INFORMED**

CodeRED® is the municipality's new alert emergency alerting system intended to give residents an early warning for emergencies in the area.

You may choose to have the alert sent to you via your mobile phone as a text and/or email or to your home phone. This feature is not automatic and requires your subscription. A link can be found at www.rmofstanley.ca or you may download the free app called "CodeRED Mobile Alerts".

Visit www.rmofstanley.ca or call the Admin office to receive additional information and to sign up for this service.

If you have previously signed up on the City of Morden website you will need to re-apply and confirm your subscription through the RM of Stanley. This will ensure you are notified of any emergency affecting the area wherever you are located.

The system will alert you in situations such as severe weather events and community emergencies.

The free app on your mobile phone will also alert you when travelling in Canada or USA of emergencies being broadcast from any nearby centres who are CodeRED subscribers.

If you do not have internet access you may pick up a form at the Admin Office during regular office hours.

The sign up is free and your contact information will be held in the strictest confidence used only for the purposes of contacting you in case of emergencies.


A change of plans had Ed Penner & the North Border Band performing on the back of a pickup while visitors to the park enjoyed the entertainment!

#### 2015 Summer Projects Update

The municipality has been busy this summer completing a number of projects. 1.5km of sidewalk have been installed in the Village of Reinland along with several stretches in the Village of Reinfeld.

The Village of Reinfeld has also received 4.8km of paved road as part of the new Village Paving Program. Council looks forward to continuing this program next year.

28 miles of dust-proofing was completed along with approximately 900 miles of ditches being sprayed for weeds.

Drainage and culvert projects and road re-build projects throughout the municipality.

# Reminders for the Fall & Winter Season.....

### Fall Checklist:

- Fences within 15 feet of the road edge must be removed before winter.
- If you have given the municipality permission in previous years to perform snow ridging but would not like us on your property this year, please contact the public works department.
- Bales, dirt piles, equipment and the like should be stored well away from the Right-of-Way to avoid snow from drifting across roadways.

### Reminders for the Winter Season:

- Snow clearing will be performed in a timely fashion when it is safe to do so. Our goal is to provide safe open roadways for
  public use. We would appreciate the public's assistance and refrain from pushing snow across public roadways as this can
  cause hazardous driving conditions as well as damage to municipal snow clearing equipment. Snow clearing concerns
  regarding highways or PR roads should be directed to Manitoba Highways Department. Please proceed cautiously when
  approaching a snow plow as visibility is reduced.
- All new driveway installations and driveway extensions onto municipal roads require RM approval. Any work done on driveway approaches must be approved by the public works department. Any structures extending higher than your approach should be removed, or at a minimum clearly marked as to avoid damage to snow clearing equipment.

# Spring 2016 Drainage

Drainage on private property must be licensed by MB Water Stewardship. RM public works staff can assist you with this process. For an appointment please call the Administration Office.
